This year has been speedy. Speedy but not rushed. The Board of Directors has been active and worked steadily on maintaining the Community Center to keep it a welcoming and comfortable meeting place for the community.

Together with the Redington NRCD we supported the Rainwater Harvesters Certificate Program. This UofA Extension Service Water-Wise program is designed to promote erosion control and water conservation, to support the creation of passive and active collection systems serving as public demonstration sites. The Community Center is now such a place. This project is an on-going one which will keep all of us busy for as long as rain falls. We hope this will be for a long, long time. We can construct loose rock dams, install water catchment systems of all sorts, and Mother Nature will keep us busy if not out of trouble! The students of this class will be available to share workbooks and expertise with the community.

Please visit the additions: new gutter on the porch, new landform, new trees, new and ongoing erosion control on the hill behind MTE.

Unlike previous years, the Community Center has held no fundraisers for itself. We are very grateful to the Midvale Telephone Exchange for their rent in exchange for building site and use of the Community Center. MTE has provided, in addition, wireless internet service and local telephone access. (We wrote a letter of support for MTE's project to provide 'fiber to home' highspeed internet service.)
